- Listen to the story all the way through once and just enjoy listening to another language.
- Then listen again and look at the written words. Can you spot any of the words you can hear being read? This is a tricky skill that takes practice, so don't worry if you find it difficult.
- See how many numbers you can spot.
- Can you work out what some of the words in French mean in English? You can always use the pictures to help you.
- How many days of the week can you spot in French?

If you think you have found all the days of the week, have a look at the “days of the week” worksheet and see if you can match the correct French word with the correct English word. Then cut, stick and copy (coupez, collez et copiez).
