# Folded Paper Butterfly Activity Instructions

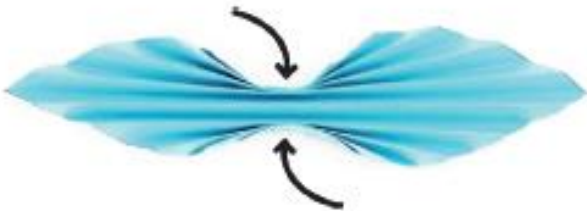
- ① Cut out both of the templates carefully.



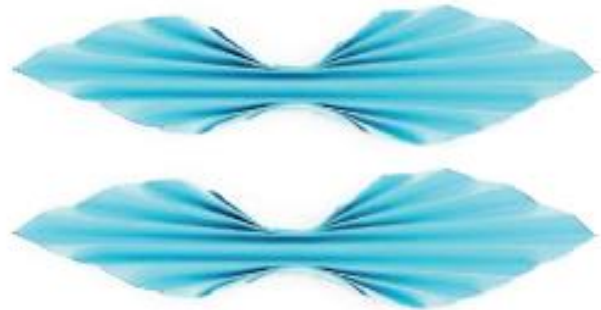
- ② Take one of your squares and turn it so it looks like a diamond. Accordion fold your sheet using the lines to help you, starting from the bottom corner all the way to the top.



- ③ Add some glue and press the top and bottom together to create a set of wings.

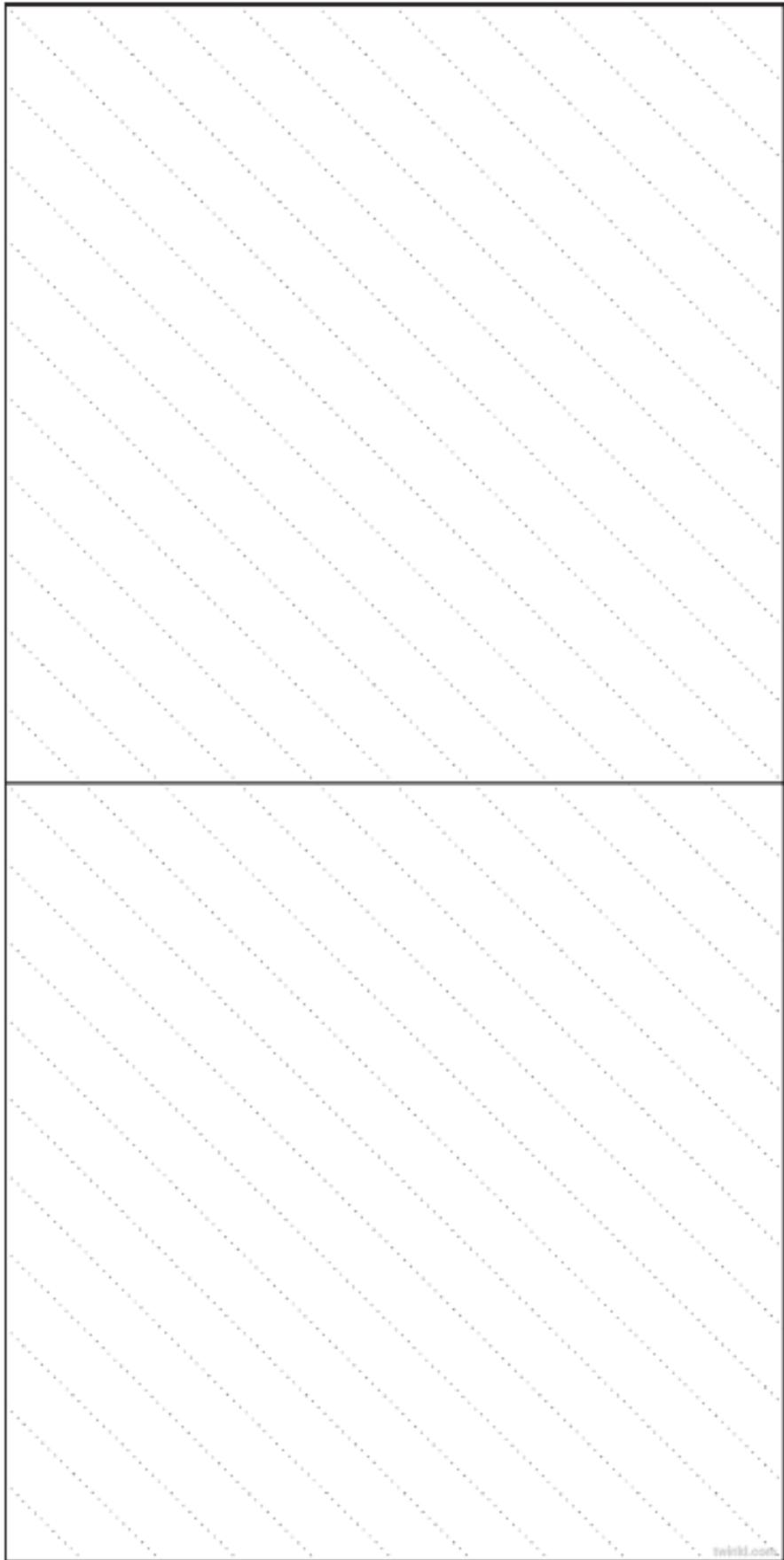


- ④ Repeat steps 2 and 3 with the second sheet of paper.



- ⑤ Put both sets of wings together and wrap a pipe cleaner around them to make a butterfly body and antennae. Your butterfly is complete!

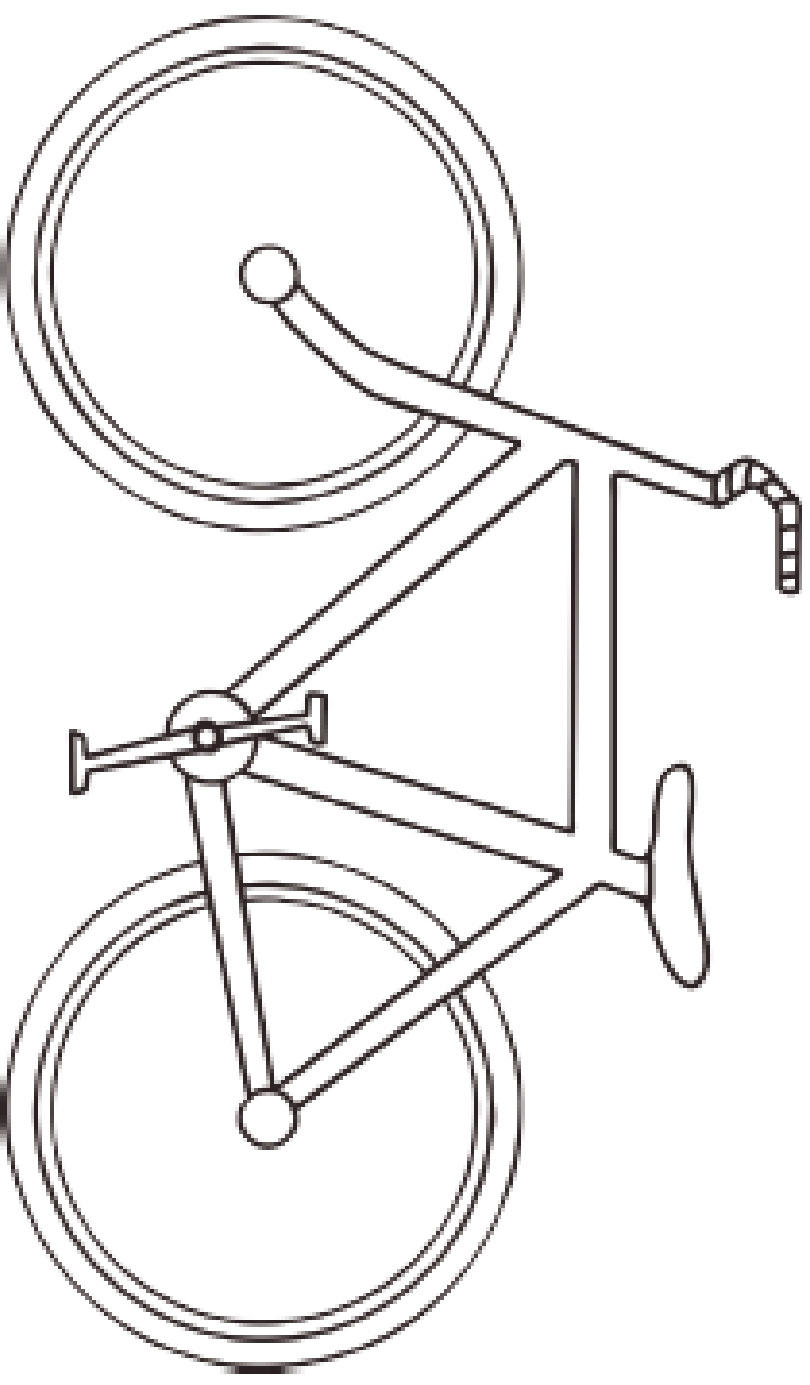


# Design a Bike for a Round-the-World Trip
